## Why Inspect?

Semiannual (Every 6 months) facility inspection are required from:

- United States Department of Agriculture (USDA <u>AWARs</u>)
- > Office of Laboratory Welfare (NIH/<u>PHS Policy</u>).
- > The Guide for the Care and use of Laboratory Animals
- The purpose of the Semi-Annual Inspection is for the IACUC to assess the institutions animal research program compliance with all applicable mandates using the "Guide" as their bases.



Corrective Actions and Reporting Commitments

#### USDA AWARs & NIH PHS Policy \*Require\*

"Significant" & "Minor" deficiencies to be:

- 1. Distinguished in the semiannual program review reports.
- 2. Contain a reasonable and specific plan and deadline for correction.

# GENERAL FLOW DAY OF INSPECTIONS: Meet as a team Inspect ID Findings Consult w/Team Finding sent to lab Response with set time Review response for completeness

#### **BEHIND THE SCENES**:

Determine Classification: Comment, Minor, (IACUP Scribe) or Significant / "Grey Areas" (consult w/ Team) Significant - Reviewed with IACUC Director

ALL MINOR & SIGNIFICANT FINDINGS REPORTED

- 1. PROGRAM REVIEW
- 2. FULL COMMITTEE (Pending Items Completed)
- **3**. IO

## Identify deficiencies and classification: Minor vs Significant

- A significant deficiency is defined as one that, in the judgment of the IACUC or the Institutional Official, is or may be a threat to the health or safety of animals. (human health concerns are referred to occ health and/or eh&s)
- Serious breach of policy or conditions
  - Immediate or emergent

Clear health and welfare cases

- Programmatic
- Repeat/Continuing

#### Deficiencies - Minor

- A minor deficiency refers to a problem for which an immediate solution is not necessary to protect life or prevent distress.
- Facility issues, non-welfare related or infrequent findings
  - peeling or chipped paint
  - Pests
  - Improper signage
  - Food barrel without a top
  - Clutter
  - ► PPE
- Comments items to note that were very good or not quite a deficiency, or an out of scope item

#### A Quick Glance: Correction Schedule Chart

Score	Comment, Minor, Significant	Considerations	Correction Response time	EXAMPLES
1-2	Comment - Minor	Limited Time Avail.	Up to 3 weeks (2nd & 3rd) Request -3 days/ each	Hole in wall, light out/Clutter, dirty surfaces, daily record missing entry - Grey Area: sx record no analgesics recorded or no next day entry
3	Significant	Not Immediate Health	3 days	Animal found dead in lab OR LARC space w/ no food and/or water in cage.,
3	Significant	Immediate Health Threat	Same Day	Animal past endpoint and not monitored per protocol, Unapproved study resulted in distress or animal welfare (e.g. labored breathing)

### Inspection Complete? NO!

- ► IACUP "Scribe" Action behind the scenes
  - Following inspection: Consultation and Scoring
  - > Determine deficiency corrective plan/schedule
  - > Communicate deficiency and corrective plan to PI/labs swiftly!
  - > Document all responses
  - Generate report/program review for IACUC and IO

# Summary

- Chamber types: Multiple types, parameters, check-sheets, action plans and emergency contacts.
- Significant vs Minor determinations are more than surface observations.
- Communication of deficiencies/Corrective action and deadlines
- > Culminate in the semi-annual program review.
